Dr. Kevin Wiseman was born in Ontario, but considers Saskatoon "home" having been raised there until he came to Vancouver in 1989.

A common theme is that Dr. Wiseman likes to keep himself busy with things he enjoys. He was a middistance runner in track and field in university, and an interesting fact is that his 1000 m local record set in 1989 was just finally broken.
